



Arrival at The Welcome Centre



The entrance to the Welcome Centre is on the corner of the building that is closest to the railway station.

See earlier sections for arrival by different types of transport.



There is a double set of doors (1500mm wide). These are automatic doors that are opened with a push button to the right of the door (at a height of 880mm). The doors open into the centre.



Push this button to make the doors open.

About The Clifftop Trail


A beautiful 1 mile walk through woodland, scrub and clifftop.

Surfaced paths which are rough in places, with some hills and one steep hill, with no gates or stiles.

The Clifftop Trail follows the 'Round the Head' path made by Victorian businessman and builder George Burt.

On the trail, follow the white arrows on the waymarks. On the map, look out for the numbered and colour-coded things of interest.

The walk takes about 1 hour


Disabled car parking
